



Grows slowly at first, then quickly. Tolerates poor soils; water regularly during first few years, thereafter fairly drought tolerant. Drainage must be good. Uses: screening, holiday greens.			
	<b>Fir, Grand</b> <i>Abies grandis</i>				Ht: 120' X sp 30'. Pyramidal conifer, Prefers moist, well-drained soil. Drought tolerant. Shade intolerant. Uses: Christmas trees, non-splitting lumber	1 GAL	\$6.00

	<b>Chokecherry</b> <i>Prunus virginiana</i>				Ht: To 20' X Sp: 25'. Decorative tree, attractive foliage sometimes a deep maroon with yellow to red fall color. Flowers borne in dense cylindrical clusters followed by shiny blackish cherries enjoyed by birds. Well-drained soil with ample moisture. Uses: ornamental, forest understory.	1 GAL	\$7.00	
	<b>Cranberry, Highbush</b> <i>Viburnum edule</i>				Ht" 10', deciduous shrub with bright red leaves in fall, small white flowers in spring. 	<b>Currant, Red Flowering</b> <i>Ribes sanguineum</i>			 Forage	Ht: To 10' X Sp: 8'. Deciduous, multi-stemmed, bushy. Bright red flowers in early spring followed by blue-black berries in the fall. 	<b>Dogwood, Yellow Twig</b> <i>Cornus sericea var. flaviramea</i>				Ht: to 6' Sp: to 6' Deciduous shrub, small white flowers bloom May-June. White fruit in summer, red leaves in fall. Bright yellow winter branches provide winter interest. Full sun to part shade, in medium to wet soil. Tolerates many soil types. Attracts birds and butterflies. 	<b>Elderberry, Red</b> <i>Sambucus racemosa</i>				Ht: To 10' X Sp: 10'. Deciduous, multi-stemmed, bushy. Creamy white flowers in spring followed by bright red berries. Fast growth rate. 	<b>Hawthorn, Black</b> <i>Crataegus douglasii</i>				Ht: To 30' X Sp 12' Large shrub, can form thickets, drought tolerant, but tolerates brief flooding. 	<b>Ninebark, Pacific</b> <i>Physocarpus capitatus</i>				Ht: To 12' X Sp: To 6'. So named because of their peeling bark. 	<b>Serviceberry, Saskatoon</b> <i>Amelanchier alnifolia</i>				Ht: To 10' X broadly spreading. Deciduous, multi-stemmed, arching branches. 	<b>Silk Tassel, Fremont</b> <i>Garrya fremontii</i>				Ht: 10' Sp" 10' Evergreen, dioecious shrub. Catkins grow to 3" long, tiny flowers bloom mid-winter to mid-spring. Round, berry-like purple fruits. Grows in thickets and open woods. Grow in full sun-part shade in well-drained moist to dry soil. Drought tolerant. 	<b>Spirea, Subalpine</b> <i>Spiraea densiflora</i>				Ht: To 3' X Sp: 3'. Small upright shrub. Dark green deciduous leaves are wooly white beneath, turn yellow in fall. 	<b>Spirea, Western</b> <i>Spiraea douglasii</i>				Ht: to 6'. Erect shrub. Excellent for restoring wetlands and controlling erosion on ditch banks or wet areas. Spreads by rhizomes. <b>Aster, Eaton's</b> <i>Aster eatonii</i>				Ht. 2-4' Deciduous, rhizomatous perennial. Often pink flowered, prefers moist places. Blooms late summer.	Tall pot	\$4

	<b>Larkspur, Common</b> <i>Delphinium trollifolium</i>				Ht: To 2' X Sp: To 2'. Herbaceous perennial. Light to dark blue flowers in early summer. Need rich, porous soil in moist situation.
